

AIDS Help does more than help AIDS patients

Affordable housing and assisted living are continuing projects

AIDS Help began in 1986, when the disease was in full force with no cure. Everybody in Key West knew somebody infected or dead from the virus, according to AIDS Help Executive Director Scott Pridgen.

"When the AIDS epidemic came on the scene nobody knew what was happening and it was a death sentence," Pridgen said.

The organization had a very modest beginning — supporters sold beads at Fantasy Fest. Their efforts did not go unnoticed and eventually AIDS Help partnered with Fantasy Fest to create a unique fundraiser. Now candidates vie to be named king and queen by raising the most money for AIDS Help with a series of events ranging from cocktail parties to bingo games. The most money raised was in 2003, \$413,000, when Bill Anderson was crowned king and Nadene Grossman crowned queen. The lion's share of the funds go to meet AIDS Help's housing goals.

Due to medical advancement, HIV-positive patients are living longer. AIDS Help has responded by widening the scope of its services in 1989 to provide housing. It now has 96 residential units available not only to AIDS patients, but also others who are in need.

"Our properties diversified four years ago to include people with disabilities, the

elderly, homeless veterans and low-income households. Our organization recognizes a housing problem in the community and we decided to do something about it," said Pridgen. "You cannot do anything in life unless you are housed."

AIDS Help continues to provide new services to the community. In 2014, a portion of the king and queen campaign will

help fund an assisted living program, where nurses and specialists take care of low-income elderly clients in the comfort of their own home, in partnership with Island Home Care. The nurses and home health aides also treat HIV positive patients younger than 65 because they often have medical problems linked to AIDS and the strong medication.

"While the discussion regarding assisting living in the Lower Keys has been going on for quite a while, the same obstacles that have kept development stagnant have been embraced by the collaboration of AIDS Help and Island Home Care. We saw opportunity where others saw roadblocks," said Kim Wilkerson of Island Home Care. "The lack of avail-

able and affordable land, along with governmental bureaucracies and an overall high cost of living has made creating an assisted living facility burdensome. So, instead of waiting for an assisted living facility to be built, we are bringing assisted living to the individual home. People don't want to leave their homes and, now, they don't have to."

AIDS Help also participates in educational outreach programs. In collaboration with Woman-kind, it is helping educate Keys youth about sexually transmitted diseases.



Facts about AIDS

More than 1.1 million people in the United States are living with HIV infection, and almost 1 in 6 (15.8 percent) are unaware of their infection.

Gay, bisexual, and other men who have sex with men — particularly young black/African American — have disproportionately high HIV numbers.

By race, blacks/African Americans face the most severe burden of HIV.

CDC estimates that 1,144,500 persons aged 13 years and older are living with HIV infection, including 180,900 (15.8 percent) who are unaware of their infection. Over the past decade,

the number of people living with HIV has increased, while the annual number of new HIV infections has remained relatively stable. Still, the pace of new infections continues at far too high a level — particularly among certain groups.

HIV Incidence (new infections): The estimated incidence of HIV has remained stable overall in recent years, at about 50,000 new HIV infections per year. Within the overall estimates, however, some groups are affected more than others. Men who have sex with other men continue to bear the greatest burden of HIV infection, and among races/ethnicities, African Americans continue to be disproportionately affected.

HIV Diagnoses (new diagnoses, regardless of when infection occurred): In 2011, an estimated 49,273 people were diagnosed with HIV infection in the United States. In that same year, an estimated 32,052 people were diagnosed with AIDS. Overall, an estimated 1,155,792 people in the United States have been diagnosed with AIDS.

Deaths: An estimated 15,529 people with an AIDS diagnosis died in 2010, and approximately 636,000 people in the United States with an AIDS diagnosis have overall. The deaths of persons with an AIDS diagnosis can be due to any cause — that is, the death may or may not be related to AIDS.

HPV, Flu Vaccinations available on Fridays

The Florida Department of Health in Monroe County is teaming up with Womankind to fight human papillomavirus (HPV), the most common sexually transmitted disease. Certain strains of HPV can develop into head, neck, throat, cervical and other cancers later in life, which is why it's so important to get

vaccinated. The vaccine is most effective in men and women ages 9-26. Womankind, located at the corner of Truman Avenue and Eisenhower Drive in Key West, offers a walk-in clinic for HPV and flu vaccinations on Fridays from 1 to 4 p.m.

DOH-Monroe has programs that can help cover the cost of a vaccination. Anyone up to age 18 who'd like to be vaccinated must have parental consent. For more information, call 305-809-5655.

Wittekerke 'goes good' with eggs

Living in Florida and the sultry weather of the Keys, one of my favorite beers to counteract the heat is Wittekerke in the cool blue can. I call this beauty "sunshine in a can" and in my opinion it's the perfect beer for any situation. Wittekerke is from Belgium and has an ABV of 5 percent. It is classified as a witbier by style, meaning it's made up of 25 percent wheat malt and naturally cloudy since it is unfiltered. Wits, unlike German wheat beers, are flavored by spices like coriander, grains of paradise and citrus.

Allow me to tell you why I feel Wittekerke is the perfect beer for any situation, its drinkability! From the first sip you will notice an explosion of citrus full of lemon zest and orange peel. With all those citrus flavors, Wittekerke is very thirst quenching during or after any outdoor Florida activity. And because it's in a can, it's also practical for Florida activities such as boating, golfing, hanging on the beach or playing a Belgian favorite *Petanque* (the French version of Bocce Ball). Wittekerke is also a great beginner's beer; very well balanced and it doesn't pack a bite nor is it overly sweet.

Those citrus flavors also make Wittekerke an amazing beverage to pair with an array of meals. For starters, and one you might not think of, Wittekerke is known as the brunch beer. Yes, brunch! Move over mimosa. Wittekerke pairs great with eggs



in any form, and mixed with champagne or solo it makes a great man-mosa. Wittekerke is a solid companion for any chicken or seafood dish, and some traditional Belgian dishes such as Waterzooi and Mussels with frites. Personally, my go-to pairing is Wittekerke and some good, old-fashioned American tacos. Try it with something from Amigo's or Bad Boy's. Wittekerke is also the perfect beer to put out the fire of anything spicy.

Wittekerke is brewed by the Bavik brewery in the village of Bavikhove in the western part of Flanders, which is in the north half of Belgium. Wittekerke translates to "white church" in English and was the name of a popular soap opera in Belgium. Bavik Wit was the name of the original wit bier

until a deal was worked out with the producers of the soap opera. From then on, anyone on the television serial drinking beer was always sipping a Wittekerke.

The witbier style is undergoing a resurgence. Although it's a 400-year old brewing style, witbiers were extinct for a number of years until Pierre Celis revived it around 1965. Celis, a milkman turned brewer, created the beer Hoegaarden. This was known as the quintessential witbier for a long time. In the 1980's his brewery burnt down. Celis was forced to sell his brewery to InBev.

Today, I would feel confident putting Wittekerke against Hoegaarden in any taste challenge. Both beers are outstanding in their own way, but I feel the blast of citrus you get and the fact that it comes in a can makes Wittekerke shine as the true witbier for Key West.


Tom Luna and Will Thompson will be the hosts for this festival which showcases local musi-

Hypertension: a sneaky blood pressure condition

Often patients have no idea their arteries are narrowing

High blood pressure is a common condition in which the force of the blood against your artery walls is high enough that it may eventually cause health problems, such as heart disease.

Blood pressure is determined by the amount of blood your heart pumps and the amount of resistance to blood flow in your arteries. The more blood your heart pumps and the narrower your arteries, the higher your blood pressure.

You can have high blood pressure (hypertension) for years without any symptoms.

Even without symptoms, damage to blood vessels and your heart continues and can be detected. Uncontrolled high blood pressure increases your risk of serious health problems, including heart attack and stroke.

High blood pressure generally develops over many years, and it affects nearly everyone eventually. Fortunately, high blood pressure can be easily detected. And once you know you have high blood pressure, you can work with your doctor to control it.

Although a few people with early-stage high blood pressure may have dull headaches, dizzy spells or a few more nosebleeds

than normal, these signs and symptoms usually don't occur until high blood pressure has reached a severe or life-threatening stage.

Changing your lifestyle can go a long way toward controlling high blood pressure. Your doctor may recommend you eat a healthy diet with less salt, exercise regularly, quit smoking and maintain a healthy weight. But sometimes lifestyle changes aren't enough.

In addition to lifestyle changes, your doctor may recommend medication to lower your blood pressure.

Your blood pressure treatment goal depends on how healthy you are.

Blood pressure measurements:

• Normal blood pressure.

Your blood pressure is normal if it's below 120/80 mm Hg. However, some doctors recommend 115/75 mm Hg as a better goal. Once blood pressure rises above 115/75 mm Hg, the risk of cardiovascular disease begins to increase.

• **Prehypertension.** Prehypertension is a systolic pressure ranging from 120 to 139 mm Hg or a diastolic pressure ranging from 80 to 89 mm Hg. Prehypertension tends to get worse over time.

• Stage 1 hypertension.

Stage 1 hypertension is a systolic pressure ranging from 140 to 159 mm Hg or a diastolic pressure ranging from 90 to 99 mm Hg.

• Stage 2 hypertension.

More severe hypertension, with a systolic pressure of 160 mm Hg or higher or a diastolic pressure of 100 mm Hg or higher.

"Our pizzas are based on various styles," he said. "They are very popular."


He said the luncheon sausage fest pizza is one of his best sellers.


a shotgun.

The snowbirds are coming! And by that I don't mean northerners heading to Key West for the winter. What I mean instead are kettles of hawks and white pelican formations that will soon be flying overhead.

The great migration begins later this month but Key West might be the end of the road for many younger birds unfamiliar with their seasonal flight. Some will be too exhausted and unable to begin the next leg of their journey, the 90-mile sea crossing to Cuba. Birds already fatigued from their flight from the Carolinas will land somewhere in Key West and never get up. But this need not be the case, especially if the community is vigilant.

That's a message the Key West Wildlife Center is keen to get out. Thomas Sweets, the Center's executive director explained how locals and visitors can help.

"The pelicans will come later

in the season and will gravitate to local docks and piers but the hawks will come first and we need the community to be on the look out. Pay attention to curbs and foliage in your neighborhood. If you notice a bird stopped in the same spot for over an hour it's probably dehydrated."

Sweets stresses that people shouldn't try to take care of the hawks themselves, no matter how harmless and tired they appear. "Their claws can puncture human skin to the bone, even when they are weak. Call

us instead and we'll send a volunteer."

The Key West Wildlife Center is a wonderfully bucolic space near White Street pier. It's tucked behind a parking lot, and by "it" I mean a Swiss Family Robinson tree house clinic beyond which is a set of structures built for birds on the mend and those few creatures that are unable to be returned to the wild. There's a small but tranquil nature preserve surrounding the facility, a freshwater pond and a pathway running through the property that leads to a set of decks designed for events and visitors to sit and find some shade.

I visited the Wildlife Center twice and saw for myself how essential and how busy the non-profit is. On the first day, both Sweets and Peggy Coontz the Center's Animal Care Director were overwhelmed with animal rescues. They clearly didn't have a moment to spare. I returned the following day, which was thankfully calmer. I asked Sweets what the Wildlife Center does and what a typical day involved.

"The main thing we do is provide all wildlife rescues, rehabilitations and releases from mile marker 0-15, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Yesterday, for example, we rescued a Double-crested Cormorant with a fishing hook embedded in its mouth, an Oven Bird that struck a window at the Montessori school, and a Red-bellied Woodpecker fledgling that was almost struck by a vehicle. When we have mornings like this, it can make our afternoons quite hectic and unpredictable trying to catch

up on aviary chores."

And there are plenty of aviary chores that need to be done, plus office work and educational programs and meeting and greeting visitors who visit the center. The place is a hive of activity, yet it is a surprisingly relaxing place to be.

According to Sweets the Wildlife Center is several years into a multi-year plan designed to put the organization on a surer path than ever before. Fundraising is happening and the facilities are being expanded. The mission of the center has also been re-worked. Once upon a time the center housed more birds than it does today. The motto they live by now, however, is "quality of life." Sick and injured animals will continue to be rescued and rehabilitated — including the islands protected feral chickens — but unless survival is unlikely every bird that comes their way will be released back into the wild.

Visit the Key West Wildlife Center or its website to check out its wish list of supplies. And look out for those weary hawks!

National Key Deer Refuge beach cleanup



Athletes to swim from Islamorada to Alligator Lighthouse

Swimmers can test their endurance while focusing attention on preserving six aging offshore Keys lighthouses Saturday, Sept. 20, during the second annual 8-mile Swim for Alligator Light.

The Atlantic Ocean challenge was started by Florida Keys artist Larry Herlth, familiar to Keys locals as "Lighthouse Larry" for his detailed, scale-model metal reproductions of Keys lighthouses. When he was 52 years old, he completed the roundtrip open-water swim to Alligator Reef Lighthouse in five hours and 11 minutes, and afterward forged the idea of a competitive group swim to promote awareness.

"We need to bring the attention to a national treasure,"

Herlth said of the iconic lighthouses. "These structures need to be saved."

The large beacons were fabricated in the 1800s, including three built before the Civil War, to warn ships away from the Florida Keys reef tract. Modern Global Positioning System navigation has replaced the need for lighthouses in the Keys and, with the exception of their navigation lights, they no longer are maintained.

Swimmers can enter the 8-mile roundtrip event solo or as two- or four-person teams. Individuals must show prior proof of completing a 1,650-meter or 1-mile swim in 35 minutes or less to compete as a solo swimmer.

Entrants have up to seven

hours to complete the course, which features an in-water start and a beach finish, ending shore-side at The Moorings resort at 123 Beach Road oceanside in Islamorada.

Awards are to be given to the top three male and female finishers overall.

Registration and check-in is set for 4-8 p.m. Friday, Sept. 19, at the Founders Park swimming pool, located at mile marker 87 bayside.

Entry fees are \$95 per individual swimmer, \$75 per person for members of a two-person team and \$50 per person for members of a four-person team. Admission for spectators is free. Swimmers can register at www.swimalligatorlight.com or at www.active.com.
